- : Apple trees are graded according to stem diameter or (caliper), overall height of tree will vary from one cultivar to the next, in general however, most trees should be between 6-8'.
- : Apple planted in areas with heavy deer population need to be caged
- : Tree protectors are also recommended to protect from mice, voles, rabbits and weed whackers
- : M-7 rootstock is semi dwarfing with mature trees reaching 12-14' if left un-pruned
- : Spacing for apple should be about 15' x 15'
- : Two or more of the same variety of apple serve cross pollination needs, the Antanovka is an excellent choice also.
